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STUDENT'S FEEDBACK ON CURRICULUM ANALYSIS REPORT

YEAR 2021-22

The Undergraduate and postgraduate students filled a total of about 108 subjects that are a part of CBCS (83 subjects) as well as Regular pattern (25 subjects) through Google forms. They responded on total 10 questions regarding the extent of coverage of course, depth of course content, Learning values and skills, availability of Practical and clinical facilities, availability of study materials, UniversityTheory and practical exam &Internal exams, Feedback system related to student's performance in exams and opinion about extra-curricular activities. After thorough analysis, Very good to Good responses were obtained on all domains whereas satisfactory-unsatisfactory responses were obtained in domains of extend of course coverage (12.6%), depth of course content (15%), learning values(14.5%), learning skills (15.3%), applicability of syllabus in real life (10%) in the subject of Device innovation & IPR adequacy of available practical facilities(20%), availability of clinical facilities(18.6%), availability of relevant library books(25.2%) especially in the subject of Device innovation & IPR, extracurricular activities (30%), University practical exam pattern (22%). These lacunas were discussed with Principal and suggestions given were:

- 1. Efforts are taken to focusmore practical sessions and its practical applicability in OPD as much as possible.
- 2. Arrangement of camps and student out postings for Final year & Vth SEM BPT CBCS students in Community PT and Public Health subjects respectively.



- 3. PGs will be involved in teaching basic topics for BPT students which will indirectly improve the PGs teaching skills and help them practice their soft skills.
- 4. Class incharges are instructed to monitor the everyday lecture schedule and attendance of the students and post it in Parents Whatsapp group.
- 5. Student involvement in NSS activities will be increased.
- 6. Students will be involved in more research related activities and conferences.
- 7. Students will be involved in various organizing teams for Physiotherapy Day activities.
- 8. They will also update them about the approved revisions in CBCS Syllabus.
- 9. Academic schedule & tentative exam schedule will be provided at the beginning of academic year.
- 10.Student participation should be encouraged in Extracurricular and sports activities in the college as well as in Inter-college events.
- 11.Various Medical/ PhysiotherapyDay events will be planned in correlation with the curriculum such that students can find its applicability in real life situations.
- 12. Practical OPD postings have to be applied for 1st& 2nd SEM BPT CBCS students for certain hours in a week as per the hours mentioned in the curriculum for Basic skills in Patient care.

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STUDENT CURRICULUM- FACULTY EVALUATION BY STUDENTS

ANALYSIS REPORT

YEAR 2021-22

A total of 108 Undergraduate and Post-graduate subjects are taught been taught by approximately 60 teachers (20 teachers from Physiotherapy Department and rest from Medical department). Students have rated the faculty's performance based on the subjects taught by them. They were rated on questions related to knowledge base of teacher, preparation of teach session, communication skills, ability to answer students queries, accessibility to teacher in & out of classroom, ability to design quizzes/tests/assignment etc, fairness of teacher during assessment, etc. After thorough analysis, the maximum feedback response varied from Very good -Good (64 -80%) on all the above domains for all teachers while few satisfactory to unsatisfactory responses (0-5%) were obtained on all domains for few teachers in subjects like Kinesiotherapy -I (motivational ability, accessibility of staff, preparation of teaching session, ability to simplify topics); Anatomy (all domains); Diagnostic radiology (Knowledge base, relevance of teaching content, ability to involve students in teaching sessions, ability to design SCMs, ability to answer queries, communication skills, ability to integrate content with other course materials); Thermal agents(Recent advances); etc. the above issues were reported and discussed with Principal and a staff meeting was held for the same. The following steps were taken:

- 1. Use of Student centric methods by each staff and PGs for their lectures.
- 2. Each staff was allotted certain SCMs to be completed in the given timeframe.



- 3. Regular Feedback will be taken about the difficulties in the topics taught by each staff teaching a particular subject by the Class incharge.
- 4. Feedback will also be taken from the class representative by the class incharge to understand the problems faced by them.
- 5. Revision of difficult topics will be scheduled.
- 6. CCAs will be conducted in difficult subjects.

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FACULTY FEEDBACK ANALYSIS REPORT

YEAR 2021-22

About 20 teachers have duly filled the Faulty feedback forms pertaining to 61 subjects of Physiotherapy department (59 subjects) and medical subjects. They responded on questions like structure of curriculum, clearly defined objectives, Course content, Correlation of assessment with syllabus and teaching learning methods, Internal assessment, implementation of Newer strategies of teaching learning methods, regular feedback and suggestions taken for curricular designing etc.After thorough analysis, the maximum feedback response varied from Very good - Good (50-80%) on all the above domains for all teachers while few satisfactory to unsatisfactory responses were obtained on domains like Freedom to adopt new teaching strategies(8.3%), allotment of work assignment (10%), adequate & relevant books in library (8.3%) especially in subject of Diagnostic Radiology & Device innovation & IPR, regular addition of latest books(16.3%), convenience of library timings (33.3%), adequate copies of books (10%), sufficient equipment and supplies in laboratories (24%), computer facilities(50%), etc .The above issues were reported and discussed with Principal and a staff meeting was held for the same. The following steps were taken:

1. Regular Feedback will be taken from the subject incharge& class coordinator regarding addition of new books, adequate number of bookslatest edition books, research journals and will be reported to the members of the Library committee.



- 2. Google sheets will be circulated to each staff to fill the required books and journals by the Library committee.
- 3. Training &Usage of Student centric methods by faculty for their lectures.
- 4. Each staff will be allotted certain SCMs to be completed in the given time-frame.
- 5. Laboratory incharges are requested to update the equipment list every year and send requision for any required modality / equipment.

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PROFESSIONAL FEEDBACK REPORT (2021-22)

A total of 30 feedback forms have been filled by the external examiners for the BPT & MPT University exams conducted in the academic year 2020-21 in the print form. Their responses were based on a total of 5 questions related Curriculum design & development (Theory & practical); University Practical Exam pattern; Conduction of Examination (Student's performance; logistic arrangements for Examiner & students); Examination System (CAP, Theory paper & practical exam). The examiners reported maximum Good to Very Good responses (60-85%) on Curriculum design & Development, University Practical Exam Pattern, Conduction of Practical exam, Logistic arrangements for Examiners & students and Examination System. Majority of the examiners (95-100%) reported Satisfactory- Good- Very Good responses on Student's overall performance in terms of theory exams & practical exams. One examiner gave positive response in terms of good handling of exam procedures by convenor and staff. The Examiner also gave few Suggestions like:

- 1. More Practical sessions for Modalities.
- 2. Increase student's clinical exposure in terms of Patient handling and treatment approaches.
- 3. Digital evaluation of University Theory papers will be time saving & fast completion of task

These points were discussed with Principal and the following decisions were carried out :

- 1. Exam cell inchargeand staffs was notified to check the student's attire and discipline, checking of mobile phones at the time of exams and accordingly strict action will be taken.
- 2. Staff has been asked to enroll into Swayyam app and other resources to update themselves continuously, attend conferences and workshops.







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ALUMNI FEEDBACK REPORT (2021-22)

A total of 15 Alumni students filled the Alumni Feedback form. They responded on questions related to Academic feedback (Curriculum, teaching learning methods, guidance and cooperation from faculty, Soft skills); Nonacademic feedback (Classrooms, Laboratories & equipments, Sports & cultural, library facilities, campus) and general feedback (Satisfaction from Institute, Proud as an Alumni and willingness to contribute to the Institute for its development). The feedback analyses are as follows: Very good to Good responses were obtained in all the domains whereas satisfactoryresponses were obtained in curriculum & syllabus adequacy (20%), as well as relevance for future plans (20%), guidance and cooperation from faculty (13.3%), teachinglearning methods (12%), laboratory hands on skills (20%), clinical hands on skills (33.33%), teaching -learning methods uses (40%), communication skills(33.3%), research skills(13.3%), working as team member (13.3%), planning and organizational skills(26.7%), computer facilities (33.3%), hostel (20%) while unsatisfactory responses were obtained in Computer facility (6.7%). There were a few suggestions from the Alumni students which are as follows:

- 1. More opportunities of Hands on training on patients during OPD –IPD hours for BPT students as well as out-postings.
- 2. Conduct workshops on advanced therapeutic techniques.
- 3. Arrange more research workshops by best/known researchers.
- 4. Need for a research laboratory.
- 5. Conduct curricular & extra- curricular activities with proper year plan.

These suggestions were reported to Principal and the following steps were taken:




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

The graphical representation of the response received is presented as below:






I - Curricular aspect

Feedback :

Over all around 143 students took part in the feedback to respond to various question related to the curriculum On the curricular aspect It was noticed that, majority of student i.e. >50% of the students have responded "Good" on the academic front. Most of the students were satisfied with the course content and teaching method. Baring a few students most of the feedback received was positive. Some of the departments like MSc Clinical Nutrition students pointed out inadequate books in the library from their speciality. Some students suggested internship in external and also sister concerned hospitals. There was a demand for more faculty by the students. One of the student had requested for stipend to be paid to the UG internship students. One student had in particular complained about one staff in the department.



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It was noticed that, majority of students have responded that, the syllabus in creating interest in them. There is a scope for the teachers to create interest among the students about the syllabus, as around 18-20% students were only satisfied with the quality. It was noticed that, over 55% students have said that, the teacher's knowledge base and preparation to class was good. It was recommended to the teachers should continue in preparing to classes on regular basis. Most of the students have rated the teacher's presentation and communication skills as good. It was recommended that the teachers should continue improving effectiveness of presentation and communication skills in classes

There needs to be improvement in the interest generation by the teachers so as to improve the outcome of the topic.

Many students have appreciated the motivational ability of the teachers towards the students.

Most of the students have appreciated the ability of taking tests and assignments after the sessions. More than 55% students feel that, the teacher's internal assessment process was good. But 5-6% of them feel improvements in the process of internal assessment. Therefore, it is recommended to the teachers to improve the process of internal assessment of the student. Feedback and Guidance play a vital role in the development of students learning process. It was found that, over 50% students were satisfied with feedback and guidance by the teachers for their evaluation. It was observed that, over 60% students feel the overall ratings of the teacher was good. There is a scope for further improvement here and hence it is recommended to the teachers.

FEEDBACK ANALYSIS REPORT (2021-2022)

STUDENT FEEDBACK ON CURRICULUM

A total of 31 subjects were covered in the feedback form for the MGM School of Biomedical Sciences, Aurangabad for academic year 2021-2022 from 1st, 2nd & 3rd year undergraduate students.

BSc. 1st year, 2nd year and 3rd year regular batch students from 14th – 17th September 2022 through written forms. There were a total of 8 questions regarding the syllabus, Study materials and contact hours for the theory & Practical of each subject, pattern & evaluation of exam etc. was covered. After analysis these Feedback responses varied from Unsatisfactory -Satisfactory- Good - Very Good.

About 91.3% of students in 1st year regular batch gave very good responses in the area of overall rating for curriculum. Concepts for Human Anatomy there were also unsatisfactory responses in regarding to applicability / relevance to life¹¹ situation & extent of effect required by student (3.3%). (6.6%) Biochemistry, (6.6%) English, (3.3%) Physiology and (6 6 %) for National Health program.

In the 2nd Year regular & old batch as well as unsatisfactory responses were found in question related to Extent of effort required by Students (33 3%) Depth of course content including project work if any. (33 % Pharmacology) Learning Value (33 3% Physiology).

in the 3rd Year regular & old batch, as well as unsatisfactory responses were found in question related to depth of the course content including project work if any (20.0% in perfusion technology), (12.5% in OT & AT).



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(12.0% Microbiology) (24.0% CCT), Extent of coverage of course (8.0% Biochemistry) (10.0% Pathology) (10.0% MRIT) (8.3% Optometry) (22.0% Perfusion Technology), Applicability/ relevance to real life situation (10.0%) Biochemistry) (10.0% Microbiology) (10.0% Pathology), Learning Value (10.0% MRIT) (20.0% Perfusion Technology).

After Preparing Analysis of Curriculum Feedback, a Staff Meeting was held with the Director. In the meeting in brief the finding of analysis report were discussed & the following action were taken.

- Program Coordinators were requested to explain the pattern of syllabus & the exam schedule at the beginning of the academic year.
- Faculty were requested to explain in brief the evaluation pattern of exam, how an answer should be written, presentation skills, scoring marks smartly, how to present clinical topics, etc. as well as a few assignments on paper solving, doubt solving lectures & topic presentation were asked to be scheduled.
- The faculties were requested to give the list of reference books & study materials after each topic completion.
- Informed to the faculties to increase coverage of course in term of practicability, as most of the 2nd and 3rd year in-charges were also requested to keep 2 hour clinical posting.

A.- Most of the alumni responded very good with the guidance of the institution in the context of **Communication Skills** (87.5 % voted good whereas 12.5 % voted very good.).




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B.- Few number of the alumni responded very good with the guidance of the institution in the context of Working **as a Team Member** (25 % said very good & 75 % stated good.).






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Action Taken on Academic Feedback - Regarding curriculum relevance future plans & laboratory skill development, some alumni are not satisfied & mentioned that department should improve in these aspects as much as possible so, department had communicated with the Rehabilitation council of India (RCI) to make the curriculum better for all aspects of professional life also department try to its best to give best practical skills to students as much as possible in various aspects.

As per the feedback regarding institutional support in Research skills and on the aspect of Teaching methods used by some alumni also shared their unsatisfactory view, so on the research aspect all faculty of MGMIUDPO were going through trainings in Research aspect under the guidance of Research Cell of MGMIHS to guide students in research field and teachers had participated in faculty development program by which their teaching skill improved for classroom sessions.

(75 % voted as good and 25 % voted as satisfactory about Hostel facilities)






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Pictorial Representation of Alumni Feedback on Infrastructure




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7. Feedback on Teaching session allotment




8. Feedback on distribution of Work Assignment.




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B. Non-Academic:



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




















































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12. Rate the feedback system related to your performance in internal examinations















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

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

- 3. More than half number of professionals (66.7%) agree that **Examination arrangements** for student is good also remaining (33.3 %) responded very good.






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Logistic arrangements for Examiners


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
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
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How will you rate our University Examination – Theory Paper pattern & CAP System? 3 responses
