Few more advance life saving methods and techniques and skilled based courses will be introduced in the forthcoming year.




MGM Medical College, Navi Mumbai Skills Lab Feedback Report 2015-16

To impart high quality standardised procedural and clinical skills training for interns and junior doctors, Mahatma Gandhi Mission's Medical college, Hospital Navi Mumbai And MGM Institute of Health Sciences a initiated the course of Basic Life support (BLS) in 2015-2016 at MGM Skills Lab. The training curriculum and simulated clinical scenario is supportive to the professionals to know about how to perform CPR and other life saving skills at the hospitals as well as out of the hospitals.

To accept the feedback of the students, skills lab provided a training evaluation feedback forms to achieve better training experience. The evaluation is focused on the resources provided, achievement of learning objectives, aids and resources, proficiency of instructors, environs of the program, duration, convenience of trainee and overall learning experience. 78% percent of the total trainee evaluated the overall learning experience rating as "Excellent", 22% rated as "Good". 65 % students replied "Excellent" on the achievement of learning objectives.35% replied as"Good" to meet the learning objectives. 80% Students rated the training equipments "Excellent" while 20% rated it "Good". Audiovisuals are evaluated as "Excellent" by 70% of the students, "Good" by 20% of the students and 10% satisfactory. 95% of the students felt that presenter's ability to communicate the course content was "excellent" and 5% felt that it was "Good". The environs of the programe was rated as "Excellent" by 87% of the trainee and 13% evaluated it as "Good". ' 69% of the trainee felt that the time duration of the practical session was the "Excellent", while 24% replied as "Good" where as remaining 7% felt it should be more hence replied "as "satisfactory". On the basis of convenience of the course emphasizing on day/time was rated "Excellent by" 27% of the trainee and 62% rated "Good" and 11% rated as "satisfactory".



Practical hands on sessions are going to be conducted in the well equipped lab and under the guidance of healthcare professionals.

MGM skills lab received feedback for the excellence in the training for the (2015-16) last year. Continuing with same feedback tool(format) base on the resources provided, achievement of learning objectives, aids and resources, proficiency of instructors, environs of the program, duration, convenience of trainee and overall learning experience. 




The graph given below illustrating the feedback of the BLS training 2018-19,

INFRASTRUCTURE AND EQUIPMENTS

Department has adequate infrastructure for staff, office and lecture halls. Different rooms are available for practicing BLS and ACLS skills on dummy, nursing anne, sim man 3 G simulator. Debriefing room and waiting hall is also there

Equipments & mannequins

Skill development unit helps to ensure that all students acquire the necessary practical skills and are properly assessed before practicing on real patients. Faculty can create complicated scenarios for the students to learn. 19 mannequins are available in skill laboratory.

- 1. Little Anne: 01
 - Used for training of pediatric basic life support (Chest compression and artificial ventilation).
- Baby anne: 02
 Used for training of infant basic life support (Chest compression and ventilation) and foreign body obstruction management.
- Resusci Anne: 2
 Training of adult basic life support, airway obstruction and foreign body obstruction management.
- 4. Rescusci anne QCPR full body with skill guide: 01 Objective assessment of quality of CPR is possible by assessing rate, depth and recoil of chest compression. It also helps to know the rate and adequacy of artificial breath with the help of monitor. This is used for assessment of BLS skill accuracy. After learning BLS skill on Resusci Anne skill is tested on QCPR.
- 5. Laerdal airway management trainer: 01

 It is used to train for placement of oropharyngeal and nasal airway, Laryngeal mask airway (LMA) and Endotracheal tube placement in adults.
- 6. Pediatric intubation trainer: 01

 It is used to train for placement of oropharyngeal and nasal airway,

 Laryngeal mask airway (LMA) and Endotracheal tube placement in children
- 7. Neonatal intubation trainer: 01

 It is used to train for Endotracheal tube placement in New born baby

8. Resusci anne advanced skill trainer: 01

In addition to basic life support, this is used for training of advanced life support (Defibrillation, cardio version). Scenario based training can be given in relation to cardio respiratory system problems.

9. Multivenous IV training arm: 01

Training of peripheral venous (Cephalic, basilic and dorsum of the hand) canulation in adults can be demonstrated.

10.Pediatric IV training arm: 01

Training for peripheral venous (Cephalic, basilic and dorsum of the hand) canulation in children can be demonstrated.

11. Arterial arm stick: 01

Training of radial artery puncture for collecting blood sample for ABG and arterial canulation for intra arterial blood pressure monitoring.

12.IV Torso: 01

Training of central venous canulation (Internal jugular, subclavian and femoral veins) can be given

13.Blood pressure training arm: 01

Training of how to take blood pressure with the help of aneroid blood pressure recorder is given by using palpatory and auscultatory method. Systolic, diastolic pressure, auscultatory gap and heart rate can be set up by trainer and is objectively assessed.

14. Nursing anne with simpad cable: 01

Is use to train about nursing care of the patient. Training can be given how to take of eyes, nose, mouth, colostomy and urinary catheter. Insertion of Nasogastric tube Foleys catheter, placement of oxygen mask and nasal canula, peripheral venous line insertion, intra muscular injection, subcutaneous injection on abdomen, artificial ventilation. Training of administration of enema can be given. Basic vital science like respiration and auscultation of heart sounds can be taught. Scenario based training can be given with the help of simpad

15.Prompt birthing (delivery)simulator: 01

This is used to train process of normal labour and delivery of placenta.

16.Sim man 3G:01

This is a simulator used to train basic life support, advanced life support. Apart from technical skill training, it is also useful for team—dynamics training and improving communication. We can demonstrate various clinical signs like papillary reaction, different respiratory sounds, difficult airway, heart sounds and murmurs, abdominal sounds, peripheral pulses. Various types of x-rays and laboratory reports can be incorporated to create the scenarios. Instructor in two way communication laboratory will be monitoring the skills of the trainers. Debriefing can be done at the end by the team leader.

17. Arrhythmia simulator: 01

Used to teach all arrhythmias used with multi-parameter


18.AED Trainer: 01

Automated external defibrillator is a model for training how ventricular fibrillation can be treated by giving shock. Machine gives automated instructions which are followed by trainer

19. Cricothyrotomy model: 01

Used to train how to establish emergency airway when one cant intubate and ventilate the patient.
