Over 60 million people worldwide are diagnosed with glaucomatous optic neuropathy, which is estimated to be responsible for 8.4 million cases of irreversible blindness globally. Glaucoma is associated with characteristic damage to the optic nerve and patterns of visual field loss which principally involves the loss of retinal ganglion cells (RGCs). At present, intraocular pressure (IOP) presents the only modifiable risk factor for glaucoma, although RGC and vision loss can continue in patients despite well-controlled IOP. This, coupled with the present inability to diagnose glaucoma until relatively late in the disease process, has led to intense investigations towards the development of novel techniques for the early diagnosis of disease. The session concludes by discussing techniques to assess glaucomatous changes in the brain using MRI and the clinical relevance of glaucomatous-associated changes in the visual centres of the brain.



It was hoped by psychiatrists that historians would be interested in a dialogue with clinicians, as they had firsthand knowledge of the world of psychiatry. They encountered the mentally ill on a daily basis and they represented a potentially rich source of oral history.

There was also the hope that a dialogue with psychiatrists might serve to demystify them: historians would see that psychiatrists were perfectly ordinary people and not the ogres of mythology. Understanding risk factors early in life, whether specific to COPD or not, allows for study of interventions to optimize lung function at birth and to prolong the lung function plateau, potentially reducing the development of COPD. It is necessary to identify noninvasive ways to screen for early COPD in those at risk before progression to clinically significant disease. The session was very engaging for all who attended.

- Ranibizumab and aflibercept, used to treat vision loss from diabetic macular edema, and approximately 20 to 30 times more expensive than bevacizumab, are not cost-effective for treatment of DME compared to bevacizumab unless their prices decrease substantially, according to a study published online by JAMA Ophthalmology.
- The anti-vascular endothelial growth factor drugs have revolutionized DME treatment. A
 recent randomized clinical trial comparing anti-VEGF agents for patients with decreased
 vision from DME found that at one year aflibercept (2 mg) achieved better visual
 outcomes than repackaged (compounded) bevacizumab (1.25 mg) or ranibizumab (0.3
 mg); the worse the starting vision, the greater the treatment benefit with aflibercept.

The MGM Medical College Navi Mumbai organized an update on swine flu. Swine origin influenza was first recognized in the border area of Mexico and United States in April 2009 and during a short span of two months became the first pandemic. The currently circulating strain of swine origin influenza virus of the H1N1 strain has undergone triple assortment and contains genes from the avian, swine and human viruses.

The workshop highlighted about Its transmittal by droplets or fomites. Incubation period is 2 to 7 days. Common clinical symptoms are indistinguishable by any viral respiratory illness, and include fever, cough, sore throat and myalgia. A feature seen more frequently with swine origin influenza is GI upset. Less than 10% of patients require hospitalization. Patients at risk of developing severe disease are – younger than five years, elderly, pregnant women, with chronic systemic illnesses, adolescents on aspirin.

Of the severe manifestations of swine origin influenza, pneumonia and respiratory failure are the most common. Unusual symptoms reported are conjunctivitis, parotitis, hemophagocytic syndrome. Infants may present with fever and lethargy with no respiratory symptoms. Diagnosis is based on RT PCR, Viral culture or increasing neutralizing antibodies. Principle of treatment consists of isolation, universal precautions, good infection control practices, supportive care and use of antiviral drugs.

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



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Workshop on Embalming

A session was conducted on "Embalming "on10th July 2014. by MGM -Medical College, Kamothe Navi Mumbai, Embalming is the art and science of preserving human or animal remains by treating them (in its modern form with chemicals) to forestall decomposition.

The intention is usually to make the deceased suitable for public or private viewing as part of the funeral ceremony, or keep them preserved for medical purposes in an anatomical laboratory. The three goals of embalming are sanitization, presentation, and preservation, with restoration being an important additional factor in some instances.

Performed successfully, embalming can help preserve the body for duration of many years. Embalming has a very long and cross-cultural history, with many cultures giving the embalming processes a greater religious meaning the session was attended by 2 participants.

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Museum Specimen Mounting

A session was conducted on Museum Specimen Mounting on 10th September 2014. by MGM -Medical College, Kamothe, Navi Mumbai, attended by 2 participants.

The session was on detail study of Making of a good museum specimen it involves meticulous planning at the time of biopsy, grossing and careful handling thereafter. Oral lesions vary widely in their gross presentations, color, texture, pattern of growth and are relatively smaller and more fragile. Crafting a museum specimen requires a more skilled workmanship and flexible material to work with. We describe here the institutional experience of the use of translucent materials readily available in any histopathological laboratory combined with routine stationery in displaying a specimen to its optimal elegance.

Museum specimens are generally mounted in glass jars or Perspex boxes using center plates or glass rods to which the specimen is fixed or sutured. Use of Perspex sheets as a center plate requires the use of power tools (saw, drills, vice etc.), which in turn require time and skill to produce good results. A more feasible alternative would be polyethylene terephthalate (PET, PETE or polyester) that is commonly used for carbonated beverage and water bottles. PET provides sufficient alcohol and essential oil barrier properties, generally good chemical resistance (although acetones and ketones will attack PET) and a high degree of impact resistance and tensile strength. These bottles are translucent, thin and inert, and can easily be cut with scissors or a blade in order to adapt properly to the size of the jar. PET sheets can be easily cut, sutured to the specimens (multiple if needed) and does not visually hinder the display. For a smaller jar, a hingelike preparation of these plastic bottles gives a stable support to the specimen.

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Sterilization and disinfection 1

A session was conducted on "Sterilization and disinfection 1 "on 6th October 2014, by MGM -Medical College kamothe Navi Mumbai, attended by 1 participant.

Healthcare-associated infections (HAIs) are infections caused by a wide variety of common and unusual bacteria, mycobacteria, fungi, and viruses during the course of receiving medical care. Medical advances have brought lifesaving care to patients in need, yet many of those advances come with a risk of HAI. Overall there are an estimated 1.7 million HAIs each year in the United States that cost an estimated \$40 billion. These infections related to medical care can be devastating and even deadly. As our ability to prevent HAIs grows, these infections are increasingly unacceptable. Wherever patient care is provided, strict adherence to evidence-based infection prevention guidelines is essential to ensure that all care is safe care.

Achieving disinfection and sterilization through the use of disinfectants and sterilization practices is essential for ensuring that medical and surgical instruments do not transmit infectious pathogens to patients. Because it is unnecessary to sterilize all patient-care items, healthcare policies must identify whether cleaning, disinfection, or sterilization is indicated based primarily on the items' intended use. The information given in this session was to assist health care professionals in their judicious selection and proper use of disinfection and sterilization processes and help move health care systems toward elimination of HAIs associated with medical and surgical instruments. It is based on well-designed studies assessing the efficacy (via laboratory investigations) and effectiveness (via clinical studies) of disinfection and sterilization procedures.

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Sterilization and disinfection 2

A session was conducted on "Sterilization and disinfection 2 "on 8th October 2014. By MGM -Medical College kamothe Navi Mumbai, Maharashtra attended by 1 participant.

The information given in this session was to assist health care professionals in their judicious selection and proper use of disinfection and sterilization processes and help move health care systems toward elimination of HAIs associated with medical and surgical instruments. It is based on well-designed studies assessing the efficacy (via laboratory investigations) and effectiveness (via clinical studies) of disinfection and sterilization procedures

Healthcare-associated infections (HAIs) are infections caused by a wide variety of common and unusual bacteria, mycobacterium, fungi, and viruses during the course of receiving medical care. Medical advances have brought lifesaving care to patients in need, yet many of those advances come with a risk of HAI. Overall there are an estimated 1.7 million HAIs each year in the United States that cost an estimated \$40 billion. These infections related to medical care can be devastating and even deadly. Each year in the United States there are 46 million procedures performed on hospital inpatients and an estimated 53.3 million surgical and nonsurgical procedures performed during ambulatory surgery visits. For example, there are at least 10 million gastrointestinal endoscopies per year. Each of these procedures involves contact by a medical device or surgical instrument with a patient's sterile tissue or mucous membranes. A major risk of all such procedures is the introduction of infection. Failure to properly disinfect or sterilize equipment carries not only the risk associated with breach of the host barriers but the additional risk of person-to-person transmission (e.g., hepatitis B virus) and transmission of pathogens that contaminate the environment (e.g., Clostridium difficile).

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Culture method for all specimens

A session was conducted on "Culture method for all specimen" on 29th December 2014. By MGM –

Medical College kamothe Navi Mumbai, Maharashtra attended by 1 participant.

Microbial cultures are used to determine the type of organism, its abundance in the sample being tested, or both. It is one of the primary diagnostic methods of microbiology and used as a tool to determine the cause of infectious disease by letting the agent multiply in a predetermined medium. For example, a throat culture is taken by scraping the lining of tissue in the back of the throat and blotting the sample into a medium to be able to screen for harmful microorganisms, such as Streptococcus pyogenes, the causative agent of strep throat. Furthermore, the term culture is more generally used informally to refer to "selectively growing" a specific kind of microorganism in the lab.

It is often essential to isolate a pure culture of microorganisms. A pure (or axenic) culture is a population of cells or multicellular organisms growing in the absence of other species or types. A pure culture may originate from a single cell or single organism, in which case the cells are genetic clones of one another. For the purpose of gelling the microbial culture, the medium of agarose gel (agar) is used. Agar is a gelatinous substance derived from seaweed. A cheap substitute for agar is guar gum, which can be used for the isolation and maintenance of thermophiles.

Microbial culture collections focus on the acquisition, authentication, production, preservation, cataloguing and distribution of viable cultures of standard reference microorganisms, cell lines and other materials for research in microbial systematic. Culture collections are also repositories of type strains.

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ANTIBIOTIC SENSITIVITY TESTING

A session was conducted on "Antibiotic Sensitivity testing "on 31st January 2015 By MGM Medical College & Hospital, Navi Mumbai, attended by 1participant.

An antibiotic sensitivity test is also known as an Antibiotic Susceptibility Test. It is conducted to find out the most effective antibiotic to combat certain bacteria in the human body. he genetic material in different bacteria varies. Some are more resistant to certain antibodies. Some fungi or bacteria become resistant to certain drugs if a dose is not completed. If the bacteria are resistant to antibiotics taken by a patient, it's known as Intrinsic Resistance. The fungi or bacteria can mutate and develop resistance to an antibiotic that previously tackled it. This condition is called *Acquired Resistance*. The bacteria are got from a wound, urine or blood culture if it is found to be having more pathogens than one. The session covered the following topics:

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INTERNATIONAL SYMPOSIUM ON ADVANCES IN BIOMEDICAL SCIENCES

An "International Symposium on Advances in Biomedical Sciences" was Organized by Biochemistry Department & Indian Academy of Biomedical Sciences on 31st January 2015. MGM -Medical College kamothe Navi Mumbai, attended by 6 participants served as an appropriate venue to discuss and share the latest developments and scientific advances in biomedical, environmental health and public health.

This scientific conference continues to attract biomedical, environmental health and public health scientists and engineers who are at the forefront of research and innovation in the exciting field of environmental health, and who are dedicated to providing a scientific basis for informed decision-making regarding the cost-effective control and/or prevention of environmental hazards and environmentally-induced diseases.

It also offered excellent opportunities for networking, sharing ideas, and sustaining and/or establishing new research collaborations and partnerships.

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IDENTIFICATION METHODS FOR BIOCHEMICALS

A session was conducted on "Identification Methods for Biochemical's "on 7th march at. MGM -Medical College kamothe Navi Mumbai, attended by 1 participants.

A series of biochemical methods using heavy suspensions of organisms and chemically-were explained and described; they included fermentations, reduction of nitrate and of methylene blue, production of indole, hydrogen sulphide and acetoin, and hydrolysis of gelatin, starch and urea.

The tests use the preformed enzymes of the bacterial cells and the results are not complicated by side effects or the multiple reactions that occur in cultures growing in a nutrient medium containing the test substrate. Challenges in Bacterial **Identification** Traditional **methods** of bacterial **identification** rely on phenotypic **identification** of the causative organism

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SPORTS & EXERCISE MEDICINE

A session was conducted on "SPORTS & EXERCISE MEDICINE (Live web stream from RCPE) Venue: MGMUniversityHospital, Kamothe, 2nd floor, seminar hall, Royal College of Physicians of Edinburgh MGM Medical College, Navi Mumbai & IAP Raigad & District Branch on 07 February 2015 attended by 5 participants.

Emerging and novel concepts, a new generation of trainees untrammeled by history and the overwhelming desire for SEM to take its place amongst the panoply of mainstream specialties all help drive the evolution of the specialty in new directions. The fact that this emerging discipline is not organ, system or disease specific both allows these possibilities and creates some of the very real dangers that threaten the existence of the specialty. It is a brave experiment by the health burocrats in different countries where the core competency of individual SEM practitioners will reflect these disparate views of just what the scope of SEM entails. With the various models of SEM training that exist in different countries, there is a brief window for harmonisation of skills and training that will rapidly pass. The risk is that SEM practitioners will have little in the way of "transportable" skills given the widely differing models of practice in different countries. The broader public health engagement of SEM practitioners to promote health and prevent disease at a population level remains difficult to judge at this time. The UK Department of Health recognised this role as one of the key reasons for the recognition of SEM as a specialty. Given the relatively small numbers of SEM physicians, the limited training of SEM practitioners in public health medicine (when compared to existing public health practitioners) coupled with the lack of SEM specific representation at a policy level, it remains to be seen whether this promise will be ultimately fulfilled.

Current day clinicians need to be clear that this process of SEM governance serves their view of the specialty correctly. Governing councils and faculties should reflect clinical SEM rather than the view of SEM that other specialties and civil servants think should be in place. It is a very real danger that we could finish up training public health physicians with little in the way of SEM competency rather than what we need, which is SEM specialists with competency in public health medicine.

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USE OF BIO SAFETY CABINET & MAINTENANCE

A session was conducted on "Use of bio safety cabinet & maintenance "7th march 2014. At MGM - Medical College kamothe Navi Mumbai, attended by 1 participants. Attended by 1 participant

Biosafety cabinets are used on a daily basis for hours. Besides protection of user and sample material, the human design factors (ergonomics) of the work become more and more important. This includes reduction of the noise level (for a more convenient working atmosphere), a height adjustable stand or stool (for optimized sitting position), panorama side windows (more light within cabinet), 10° angled front sash (enables better sitting position) as well as strong light sources (better view within cabinet) to improve the working conditions. The primary purpose of a BSC is to serve as a means to protect the laboratory worker and the surrounding environment from pathogens. All exhaust air is HEPA-filtered as it exits the biosafety cabinet, removing harmful bacteria and viruses. This is in contrast to a laminar flow clean bench, which blows unfiltered exhaust air towards the user and is not safe for work with pathogenic agents. Neither are most BSCs safe for use as fume hoods. Likewise, a fume hood fails to provide the environmental protection that HEPA filtration in a BSC would provide. However, most classes of BSCs have a secondary purpose to maintain the sterility of materials inside (the "product").

Biological Safety Cabinets are generally required to comply with that country or regions standards, this requirement may be governed by an institutional body such as the TGA, FDA or WHO. Within Australia, for example, the Class II BSC is required to meet construction standards entitled AS2252.2, the document references several other standards such as AS2243.3 (safety in laboratories), that classifies the level of risk that microorganisms pose, based on their pathogenicity, mode of transition and host range along with the current preventative measures and effective treatments

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NUCLEAR MEDICINE

A session was conducted on "Nuclear Medicine" was organized by Surgery Department in association with Western Chapter of Society of Nuclear Medicine (India) in Conference Hall, 2nd Floor, MGM Hospital, Kamothe by MGM -Medical College kamothe Navi Mumbai, attended on 8th march 2015 attended 6 participants.

Nuclear Medicine is the speciality that utilises unsealed radioisotopes in the form of radio-pharmaceuticals to investigate disorders of anatomy, physiology and patho-physiology for diagnosis and/or treatment of diseases. Nuclear Medicine procedures are used for diagnosis/treatment of many types of cancers, cardiac disease, endocrine & neurological disorders etc. Nuclear medicine imaging has special importance as it can detect the molecular level activity within the body which helps in identification of disease in its earliest stage and the metastasis growth in cancer.In Nuclear Medicine procedure, the radio-pharmaceutical is injected in to blood stream or swallowed by the patient. The physiological nature of area being examined allows the accumulation of radio-pharmaceutical at the examination area. For diagnosis purpose, the gamma rays emitted from the radio isotope are detected by special detection devices (e.g. Gamma Camera, SPECT, PET) and images are reconstructed using computer algorithms. Radioisotopes such as Tc-99m, F-18, Tl-201, Ga-67 and Ga-68 are commonly used for diagnostic purpose. For therapeutic purpose, beta emitting radioisotopes are used which deliver localised radiation dose once radio-pharmaceutical accumulates at the area of interest. Radioisotopes such as I-131, Lu-177, Sm-153, Y-90, P-32 and Re-188 are commonly used for therapy.Radioisotopes in unsealed form used to carry out diagnostic and therapeutic operations in nuclear medicine practices have a potential for radiation contamination and exposure. Therefore, adequate care in ensuring safe handling of radioisotopes is required to be taken while carrying out Nuclear Medicine procedures.

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CME ON WORLD TB DAY

A session was conducted on "CME on World TB day 2014, "on 25th March 2015 by MGM -Medical College kamothe Navi Mumbai, attended by 6 participants.

This conference was designed to provide practical, clinical information to physicians, mid-level providers, nurses, epidemiologists, public health and infectious disease specialists, and other health care providers who are responsible for the management and care of patients with tuberculosis. To build public awareness about the global epidemic of tuberculosis (TB) and efforts to eliminate the disease. In 2012, 8.6 million people fell ill with TB, and 1.3 million died from the disease, mostly in low and middle-income countries.

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Ethics & Care For Older People Approaching the End of Life (Live web stream from RCPE),

A session was conducted on "Ethics & Care For Older People Approaching the End of Life (Live web stream from RCPE), MGM Hospital, Kamothe, 2nd Floor, Seminar Hall by MGM -Medical College kamothe Navi Mumbai, 3rd April 2015 attended by 3 participants.

The care of patients approaching the end of life is once again a controversial and high profile topic. The provision of high quality care to older patients with complex health and social care needs brings a unique set of clinical and ethical challenges. Lectures and interactive case discussions covered symptom control in chronic pain, vertebral fracture and advanced heart failure; ways of delivering advance care planning for older people in the community; ethical decision making in advanced dementia, around nutrition at the end of life, and around escalation of care. Lecture considered how we can deliver high-quality end of life care across the health service in the post-Liverpool Care Pathway era. A series of interactive cases was shown for exploration of practical approaches to ethical dilemmas at the end of life.

Attendees improved their knowledge of symptom control in difficult conditions, improve their decision-making in challenging ethical situations including advanced dementia, and will gain perspective on the recent debate regarding the optimal organisation and delivery of end of life care in the hospital and community.

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Awareness Programme substance use disorder and Schizophrenia

A session was conducted on "Awareness Programme substance use disorder and Schizophernia, Organized by Psychiatry Department, MGM Medical College, Navi Mumbai. MGM Hospital, Kamothe, 2nd Floor, Seminar Hall 26th June 2015 attended by 5 participants.

The co morbidity of schizophrenia and substance abuse has attracted increasing attention in the past years, with multiple potential links, including genetic vulnerability, neurobiological aspects, side effects of medications, and psychosocial factors being under discussion. The link between the use of substances and the development of psychoses is demonstrated by the high prevalence of substance abuse in schizophrenia. Apart from alcohol misuse, substances commonly abused in this patient group include nicotine, cocaine, and cannabis. In particular, heavy cannabis abuse has been reported to be a stressor eliciting relapse in schizophrenic patients. In general, substance use in psychosis is associated with poorer outcomes, including increased psychotic symptoms and poorer treatment compliance. Since both disorders have been observed to be closely interdependent, a particular treatment for schizophrenic patients with co morbidity of substance abuse is needed in order to provide more effective care. In this article, we discuss various potential modes of interaction and interdependence, and the possibility of embarking on new therapeutic paths for treating this particular population.

It has been determined that, schizophrenic patients with co-occurring substance misuse disorders are vulnerable to an increased risk of illness and injury, poorer outcomes in psychosis, and higher rates of presentation to inpatient and emergency services. Another tremendous problem involves the high occurrence of incarceration among persons with a diagnosis of schizophrenia, who abuse substances and lack stable housing. Even though the vulnerability of persons with schizophrenia to substance abuse has been emphasized, the degree of risk and adverse consequences diversify across various studies.

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GLAUCOMA & RETINA UPDATE

A session was conducted on "Glaucoma & Retina Update, Department of Ophthalmology, MGM Medical College & Hospital, Navi Mumbai on 24th August 2014 attended by 3 participants.

The Glaucoma Update discussed current and developing glaucoma imaging and testing modalities. The talks was directed towards both comprehensive ophthalmologists and glaucoma specialists and provided guidance for testing and treatment of their patients. A panel discussion was done to discuss challenging cases.

At the conclusion of this conference, participants were able to:

- · Review and assess various glaucoma diagnostic tests
- Apply newer glaucoma testing procedures in glaucoma patient care
- Learn how to manage complex glaucoma cases and refer when appropriate

With the emergence of new technologies, treatments, and clinical trial results, controversies on how to best manage patients are becoming increasingly evident. The program focused on several of these "hot" topics in a Pro vs Con debate format followed by active panel discussions.

At the conclusion of this conference, participants were able to:

- Evaluate treatment options and better understand benefits and risks of each option.
- Incorporate into practice recent study results in the management of a variety of retinal diseases
- · Assess potential future treatments and devices for managing retinal disease

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Program on Suicide Prevention

A Program on Suicide Prevention" with guest speaker Dr. Suleman Merchant (Ex-Dean and HoD Radiology, LTMMC & Sion hospital, Mumbai) by Department of Psychiatry, MGM Medical College & Hospital, Navi Mumbai on 10^{th} Sept. 2014, 1 PM -3 PM attended by 5 participants respectively.

The session was to highlights the problem, current gap, possible solutions, mental health self-care, suicide survivor stories, latest research, where to seek help and how to help somebody who's suicidal.

Educate schools, colleges, workplaces and larger society about suicide awareness and suicide prevention, and also on how to avert a crisis by dealing with depression, anxiety, stress and other mental health issues through active self-care and psychological first-aid.

Teach individuals how to respond to somebody who's suicidal or has suicide ideation through content, training, workshops, gatekeeper program (online and offline), partnerships, and assessments (depression, stress and anxiety).

Suicide is an important issue in the Indian context. More than one lakh (one hundred thousand) lives are lost every year to suicide in our country. In the last two decades, the suicide rate has increased from 7.9 to 10.3 per 100,000. There is a wide variation in the suicide rates within the country. The southern states of Kerala, Karnataka, Andhra Pradesh and Tamil Nadu have a suicide rate of > 15 while in the Northern States of Punjab, Uttar Pradesh, Bihar and Jammu and Kashmir, the suicide rate is < 3. This variable pattern has been stable for the last twenty years. Higher literacy, a better reporting system, lower external aggression, higher socioeconomic status and higher expectations are the possible explanations for the higher suicide rates in the southern states.

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"NEW AGE PSYCHIATRY"

A session was conducted on ""New Age Psychiatry", Department of Psychiatry, MGM Medical College & Hospital, ".8th October 2014, 9 AM to 4 PM By MGM -Medical College Navi Mumbai, attended by 3 participants.

A lot of people who have anxiety, depression, and other emotional and mental conditions either do not want to start pharmaceutical therapy because of the side effects they've heard of or are on pharmaceutical therapy and are tired of the side effects that they are experiencing. More and more evidence is starting to reveal that nutrients may play a big role in alleviating mood and mental symptoms. When someone wants to start a nutrient protocol, genetic testing needs to be completed to find out which nutrients should be used and which are not needed. Basically, testing helps curate a nutrient protocol specifically for the individual's symptoms and their test results. Testing involves finding variations in genes through salivary samples that research has shown to play a role in developing psychological symptoms.

The New Age movement is a religious or spiritual movement that developed in Western nations during the 1970s. Precise scholarly definitions of the movement differ in their emphasis, largely as a result of its highly eclectic structure. Nevertheless, the movement is characterised by a holistic view of the cosmos, a belief in an emergent Age of Aquarius – from which the movement gets its name – an emphasis on self-spirituality and the authority of the self, a focus on healing, a belief in channeling, and an adoption of a "New Age science" that makes use of elements of the new physics. The New Age movement evolved from an array of earlier religious movements and philosophies, in particular nineteenth-century groups such as the Theosophical Society. It also incorporates strands from metaphysics, perennial philosophy, self-help psychology, and various Indian teachings such as Buddhism, Hinduism and Yoga In the 1970s, it developed a social and political component. Its central precepts have been described as "drawing on both Eastern and Western spiritual and metaphysical traditions and infusing them with influences from self-help and motivational psychology

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Workshop on Bio medical waste management & Swine flu

A session was conducted on "Bio medical waste management & Swine flu "on 13th February 2015, by MGM -Medical College, Kamothe, Navi Mumbai, attended by 5 participants.

Medical care is vital for our life and health, but the waste generated from medical activities represents a real problem of living nature and human world. Improper management of waste generated in health care facilities causes a direct health impact on the community, the health care workers and on the environment Every day, relatively large amount of potentially infectious and hazardous waste are generated in the health care hospitals and facilities around the world. Indiscriminate disposal of BMW or hospital waste and exposure to such waste possess serious threat to environment and to human health that requires specific treatment and management prior to its final disposal. The present review article deals with the basic issues as definition, categories, problems relating to biomedical waste and procedure of handling and disposal method of Biomedical Waste Management. It also intends to create awareness amongst the personnel involved in health care unit. Biomedical waste management has recently emerged as an issue of major concern not only to hospitals, nursing home authorities but also to the environment, the bio-medical wastes generated from health care units depend upon a number of factors such as waste management methods, type of health care units, occupancy of healthcare units, specialization of healthcare units, ratio of reusable items in use, availability of infrastructure and resources etc.

Inadequate Bio-Medical waste management thus will cause environmental pollution, unpleasant smell, growth and multiplication of vectors like insects, rodents and worms and may lead to the transmission of diseases like typhoid, cholera, hepatitis and AIDS through injuries from syringes and needles contaminated with human. Inadequate Bio-Medical waste management thus will cause environmental pollution, unpleasant smell, growth and multiplication of vectors like insects, rodents and worms and may lead to the transmission of diseases like typhoid, cholera, hepatitis and AIDS through injuries from syringes and needles contaminated with human. So this session was organized to train and educate about bio medical waste management.

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Workshop on Hand Hygiene

A session was conducted on "Hand Hygiene "on 9th January 2015, by MGM -Medical College, Kamothe, Navi Mumbai attended by 5 participants.

The workshop sessions started with a short address on Hand Hygiene initially a presentation focusing on the importance of hands in daily routine and during clinical work was done. They also explained the ways of spread of microorganisms, including pathogens, from one person to another. It was emphasized that healthcare worker's contaminated hands can transfer various infections not only to the patients they are taking care of, but also to coworkers who are also at the risk for cross infections. These infections, also known as *Health care associated infections (HAIs)* are responsible for increasing morbidity, which leads to a chain of events like increased antibiotic use, increased antibiotic residues in environment, increased antibiotic resistance in bacteria, increased untreatable infections, increased loss of productive man-hours and in extreme cases mortality, all of which can have a negative impact on the public health and economy of a country.

Hand hygiene could be maintained either by use of soap and water or by using alcohol based hand rub, commonly known as sanitizer. The participants were trained to follow steps to maintain hand hygiene using these materials. The steps of 'How and when to wash hands with soap and water?' and 'How and when to use an alcoholic hand rub?' as recommended by world Health

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Workshop on Needle Prick Injury & Hazmat Protocol

A session was conducted on "Needle Prick Injury & Hazmat Protocol "on 16th January 2015, by MGM - Medical College, Kamothe, Navi Mumbai attended by 1 participant.

Needle prick Injury: the accidental puncture of the skin by a needle during a medical intervention. Accidental exposure to blood caused by needle injuries or injuries following, cutting, biting or splashing incidents carries the risk of infection by blood-borne viruses such as the hepatitis B virus (HBV), hepatitis C virus (HCV) and human immunodeficiency virus (HIV).HBV risk= 5-40% HCV risk= 3-10% HIV risk= 0.2-0.5%.HBV prevalence is higher than average in intravenous drug users, homosexual men and in people from developing countries. HCV prevalence is higher in people who have had multiple blood transfusions, in dialysis patients and intravenous drug users.

Accidental contact with blood occurs especially in the following situations:

- 1. During re-capping
- 2. During surgery, especially during wound closure
- 3. During biopsy
- 4. When an uncapped needle has ended up in bed linen, surgery clothing etc
- 5. When taking an unsheathed used needle to the waste container
- 6. During the cleaning up and transporting of waste material
- 7. When using more complex collection & injection techniques
- 8. In A&E (Accident and Emergency) departments
- 9. In high-stress interventions (diagnostic or therapeutic endoscopy in patients with gastrointestinal bleeding)

Although this does not occur very often, there are other blood-borne microorganisms which can be transmitted via blood exposure: Other hepatitis viruses, Cytomegalovirus (CMV), Epstein-Barr virus (EBV), Parvovirus, Treponema pallidum (syphilis), Yersinia AND Plasmodium.

Accidental exposure to blood following a needle stick injury is probably one of the most common occupational health accidents in medical care.

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WORKSHOP ON STANDARD PRECAUTIONS & SWINE FLU

A session was conducted on "Standard Precautions & Swine flu "on 20th February 2015, MGM -Medical College, Kamothe, Navi Mumbai attended by 3 participants.

The session presented detailed information on the causes of swine flu and preventive measures to be taken. It was said that this particular flu creates fright in people but with proper precaution, one can be saved from contracting the virus and at the onset timely treatment can be taken.

Awareness is very important especially in villages. We should be ready for any emergency and stock all necessary medicines of swine flu. Isolated wards for swine flu patients and ensure the availability of the oximeter.

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Workshop on HAZAMAT Protocol

A session was conducted on "Hazamat Protocol "on 27th February 2015 and 10th October 2014 by MGM - Medical College, Kamothe, Navi Mumbai attended by total 10 participants.

Hazardous Materials Protocol Guidelines were discussed on -

- 1. Ammonia
- 2. Chlorine
- 3. Cyanide
- 4. Heavy Metals
- 5. Hydrogen Fluoride
- 6. Hydrogen Sulphides
- 7. Methyl Bromide
- 8. Nitrogen Oxides
- 9. Organophosphates
- 10. Crush Syndrome

A Hazard Review is used to determine the appropriate protective measures needed to be implemented before the procedure is conducted to avoid accidents and injury. It is also used to write the Safety Protocol for the procedure and should become part of the research plan. Hazard reviews are conducted to prevent accidents and injuries and avoid legal liabilities that may result when all contributing factors are not fully considered, such as:

- No documented safety procedures.
- No specific training is conducted or instructions given and documented.
- Out of date chemical inventory lists.
- Material Safety Data Sheets (MSDS) not readily available.
- Chemical storage not segregated by hazard class.
- Chemical containers not labeled.
- Improper sharps disposal.
- Blocked aisles and congested work spaces.
- Prudent Practices not followed or not enforced.
- Improper use of personal protective equipment (PPE).
- Improper use of safety equipment.
- Disabling or circumventing safety devices.

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TALK ON ANTIBIOTIC POLICY

A session was conducted on "Antibiotic policy "on 26th February 2015, by MGM -Medical College, Kamothe, Navi Mumbai attended by 8 participants.

The antibiotic policy is essentially for prophylaxis, empirical and definitive therapy. The policy shall incorporate specific recommendations for the treatment of different high-risk/special groups such as immunocompromised hosts; hospital-associated infections and community-associated infections.

The hospital antibiotic policy shall be based upon: Spectrum of antibiotic activity; Pharmacokinetics/pharmacodynamics of these medicines, Adverse effects, Potential to select resistance, Cost, Special needs of individual patient groups.

Antibiotic Policy serves as a guideline for doctors to decide which antibiotic shall be used for treating a specific infectious condition. It also states practices that must be followed while using Antibiotics on patients. The antibiotic policy must ideally be developed collaboratively.

Pharmacotherapeutic committee or the Infection control committee can take a lead role in formulation of this policy, with inputs from all clinical departments. The primary aim of the hospital antimicrobial policy is to minimize the morbidity and mortality due to antimicrobial-resistant infection; and to preserve the effectiveness of antimicrobial agents in the treatment and prevention of communicable diseases.

The policy should be based on a systematic review of scientific evidence which would minimize the risk of bias. The literature should be identified according to an explicit search strategy and defined inclusion criteria assessed against consistent methodological standards. In addition, the search terms and period of search should be mentioned.

When robust evidence is not available a hybrid of a varying degree of evidence and expert opinion may contribute to develop antibiotic policy. However, this recommendation should be done with grading according to the strength of evidence supporting them. The grading should be validated based on study design and quality and of the consistency and clinical relevance.

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Workshop on documentation, Healthcare association infection, Bio medical waste management, Hand hygiene, needle stick injury protocol

A session was conducted on "Documentation, Healthcare association infection, Bio medical waste management, Hand hygiene, needle stick injury protocol "on 27th March 2015, by MGM -Medical College, Kamothe, Navi Mumbai attended by 3 participants.

Regardless of sector, size, structure, or maturity, regulated organizations must establish an appropriate quality management system (QMS) to be successful. The most important aspect of any QMS is the way in which it is documented to manifest the system hierarchy.

Healthcare interpreters have long been considered language workers. While it is true that their expertise lies in communication, healthcare interpreters must also be considered part of the healthcare workforce; and as healthcare workers, interpreters must be familiar with the specialized knowledge to be safe members of the healthcare team.

Objectives of the workshop was:

- Become a fully competent and safe member of the health care team.
- · Know how to:
 - o Avoid bringing germs to patients in health care setting
 - o Avoid bringing germs from health setting into your family and community
 - o Avoid being a vector between patients
 - o Avoid getting sick yourself
 - o Practice hand hygiene effectively and use PPE (Personal Protective Equipment)
 - o Avoid getting hurt, abused, irradiated, depressed

Sections of the workshop:

- Infection control concepts, measures, and expectations of all health team members
- Safety risks and responsibilities as a worker in the health care industry

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INDUCTION PROGRAM

An Induction program was conducted on 26th November 2014, by MGM -Medical College, Kamothe, Navi Mumbai attended by 4 participants.

An induction programme is an important process for bringing staff into an organisation. It provides an introduction to the working environment and the set-up of the employee within the organisation. The process will cover the employer and employee rights and the terms and conditions of employment.

As a priority the induction programme must cover any legal and compliance requirements for working at the company and pay attention to the health and safety of the new employee.

This session covered -

- Meaning of Induction Programme
- Induction of Employees
- Steps Involved in Induction Programme- General orientation be the staff -the personnel department, Specific orientation by the immediate boss, e.g., the manager or supervisor, Follow-up orientation (within one week up to six months) by the personnel manager or immediate boss to ensure post-employment satisfaction through talk, guidance and counseling.

- Typical Induction Programme

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INDUCTION PROGRAMME ON INFECTION CONTROL

This was an introduction session to the basics of infection prevention and control. This was conducted to discuss the following: || what is an infection || how microorganisms are transmitted || strategies we use in our everyday practice to reduce the risk of infection transmission to ourselves, patients/residents and visitors, and || your health and safety.

The Preventing infection in Care Induction programme was a short introduction to the 10 Standard Infection and Control Precautions (SICPs)

1.Hand Hygiene 2. Personal Protective Equipment (PPE 3. Respiratory Hygiene and Cough Hygiene 4. Safe Management of Blood and Body Fluid Spillages. 5. Occupational Safety 6. Safe Management of the Care 7. Safe Management of Care 8. Patient Placement/Assessment for Infection Risk Reflect 9. Safe Management of Linen Record 10.Safe Management of Waste (incl sharps)

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Workshop on Infection Control & NABH

A session was conducted on "Infection Control & NABH "on 12th November 2014 by MGM -Medical College, Kamothe, Navi Mumbai attended by total 6 participants.

Amongst various preparation that is required for preparing a hospital for accreditation, training of staff is perhaps the most important for implementation. Staff needs to be trained on various policies and procedures documented by the hospital to address NABH standards. Some of the topics require only an orientation while for some a detailed training may be required along with practical demonstration or drills. 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Workshop on Hydrant system training - Security staff

A session was conducted on "Hydrant system training - Security staff" on 11.04.15 by MGM -Medical College, Kamothe, Navi Mumbai attended by total 4 participants.

In a building, a *fire hydrant system* is a *safety measure* or *emergency equipment* required in some buildings that comprises a series of components that when assembled together provide a source of water to assist fire authorities in a fire.
