
Over the last 25 years, Keshav Srushti has grown in leaps and bounds and now has six independent institutions under its aegis, providing integrated development in versatile fields.

#### Swachh Survekshan 2018

#### Introduction:

As a prelude to encouraging cities to improve urban sanitation, Minister of Housing and Urban Affairs (formerly Ministry of Urban Development) had conducted 'Swachh Survekshan-2016' survey for the rating of 73 cities in January 2016 followed by 'Swachh Survekshan-2017' conducted in January- February 2017 ranking 434 cities. MoHUA now proposes to conduct its third survey in the year 2018.¹

The objective of the survey is to encourage large scale citizen participation and create awareness amongst all sections of society about the importance of working together towards making towns and cities a better place to live in. Additionally, the survey also intends to foster a spirit of healthy competition among towns and cities to improve their service delivery to citizens, towards creating cleaner cities.¹

The survey attempts to capture the progress in six broad parameters, including collection and transportation of municipal solid waste, sanitation related progress, and whether cities have started campaigns promoting Swachh Survekshan, engaging citizens in waste management, maintenance of community and public toilets.²

The Swachhata-MoHUA is the official app of Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs (MoHUA), GOI. The app enables a citizen to post a civic-related issue (eg; a garbage dump) which is then forwarded to the city corporation concerned and thereafter assigned to the sanitary inspector of the particular ward.

#### Planning:

The Panvel City Municipal Corporation (PCMC) had requested assistance from MGM Medical College, Kamothe, to create awareness among citizens of Kamothe, Kalamboli and adjoining areas about Swachh Survekshan 2018. The Department of Community Medicine was entrusted the responsibility by

Dean Dr. G.S. Narshetty to sensitize citizens about Swachh Survekshan 2018 and the use of Swachhata-MoHUA app, with the help of IInd MBBS students.

Regular meetings were conducted with PCMC officials and a program plan was prepared. Dr. Seema Anjenaya along with Ms. Vineeta Sharma, Health Inspector, trained the il nd year MBBS students about Swachh Survekshan, segregation and disposal of Dry and Wet waste, hazards of improper waste disposal, Composting, use of Swachhata-MoHUA App etc. These trained students would further create awareness about the same to the citizens of Kamothe, Kalamboli and adjoining areas. Relevant banners were made. Format was made to record information about Name of society, name of citizens who attended the sensitization sessions and participating Faculties and iMBBS students.



**MORE** is a super market which comprises of household products and grocery. They have got many franchises all over Aurangabad to provide easy accessibility to their customers. They are known for their quality products and hygiene of the store.



We have made a visit to one of their store to know about their waste disposal management. There the store manager provided us information about their waste management. He gave us a tour of the store. We could observe that there was different group for housekeeping. We had a talk with this group and they told us that they are divided into three sub groups, one for sanitation second for grooming and last for the waste disposal. So we requested them to tell us more about the cleanliness of their store.

The housekeeping group showed us the three different dustbins with a special colour code for each and the board telling information about each of them. They told us that one of the groups is allotted for waste segregation every morning from the store. The second group will then be separating the waste according to the colour codes of the bins. And the last group will finally be dumping the waste into a large bin provided by Municipal Corporation separately. The further being dump by the Municipal corporation members.

We have made a visit to one of their store to know about their waste disposal management. There the store manager provided us information about their waste management. He gave us a tour of the store. We could observe that there was different group for housekeeping. We had a talk with this group and they told us that they are divided into three sub groups, one for sanitation second for grooming and last for the waste disposal. So we requested them to tell us more about the cleanliness of their store.

The housekeeping group showed us the three different dustbins with a special colour code for each and the board telling information about each of them. They told us that one of the groups is allotted for waste segregation every morning from the store. The second group will then be separating the waste according to the colour codes of the bins. And the last group will finally be dumping the waste into a large bin provided by Municipal Corporation separately. The further being dump by the Municipal corporation members.

The waste water, waste from AC ducts and any spoiled liquid material has a different way of disposal. There are draining ducts at the backyard of the store where this liquid is being drained.


The toilet facilities for staff members as well as for customers are made separately for men and women. The cleanliness there is also maintained properly.

All the students participated enthusiastically in the programme although they had a tight schedule of college activities due to forthcoming final examination in the month of July 2018. All activities were well planned without affecting the scheduled academic activities. By overcoming the difficulties they have conducted the campaign which was quite successful.

**Challenges Faced :** The stake holders i.e. the local leaders and principals of the schools raised doubts about the commitment and dedication of the team. Their main concerns were regarding the followup of the activities. There was very low community participation. The people were reluctant to take up the activities.

**Field Learning :** We learned about the planning, procurement of logistics and organization of IEC activities. The art of rapport building and convincing people was also learned. As the people were reluctant, our team had to put efforts in order to convince them and eventually the team acquired the skill of dealing with unwilling people.

**Challenges Faced :** The drone mapping needed funds. Also, the physical map of the village was not available. As a result, we had to use hand made map which was not to the geographical scale and in which many places were missing. We faced resistance while administering the pledge to the villagers.

**Field Learning :** Our team learned the system of procurement of funds through proper channel. We learned to identify the problems and chalk out solutions. We gained the experience of working as a team and learned how to bring about co-ordination in our activities.

#### Activity Details

#### Segregation of solid waste into non-biodegradable and biodegradable waste

#### No. of segregation demonstrations undertaken : 12 Total No. of people who attended : 120

#### No. of hours spent : 2

**Brief Description :** At the PHC, the team demonstrated segregation of biomedical waste into animal waste, sharps, cytotoxic, etc. and its disposal in the respective colour coded bags. The general waste was segregated into bio-degradable and non-biodegradable waste.

**Methodology :** The team members with help of students and faculties of MGM, demonstrated the segregation of waste. the demonstration was carried out at the PHC and at various places inside the village.

# Organizing movie screenings (Swachh Bharat Mission (Gramin) movies : http://tinyurl.com/sbmgramin )

#### No. of screenings organized : 3 No. of attendees : 400 No. of hours spent : 2

**Brief Description** : The movie screening session was conducted among the students and teachers of Zilla Parishad School as well as other two private schools of Ladsawangi Village. They were shown movies about hand washing, personal hygiene and menstrual hygiene.

**Methodology :** The team procured the IEC movies. Permissions were sought from the principal of the respective schools. The screenings were conducted in the schools with the help of logistics supplied by the school authorities.

#### Waste Collection Drives (households/ common or shared spaces)

#### No. of households / public spaces waste collected from : 50 No. of people who participated : 150

#### No. of hours spent : 10

**Brief Description** : The team started the drive by first collecting waste from various areas of the village. Door to door visits were also made and waste collected from the households as well as shops. The local pan shop was lacking a dustbin, so the owner was sensitized regarding the use of dustbin. About 20-25 villagers accompanied the team in the drive. The villagers were also taught about the importance of wearing mask and gloves while waste collection.

**Methodology :** This drive took place with the permission of the village Sarpanch. Logistics like gloves, masks, dustbins, garbage bags were procured from the MGM Institute and Gram Panchayat.

#### Wall Paintings on public walls and government buildings (Panchayat Ghar)

#### No. of walls painted : 3 Estimated number of people sensitized : 500 No. of hours spent : 5

**Brief Description** : The wall painting session was conducted at Zilla Parishad School in which a total number of three walls were painted by the team of MGM MCH. The walls were painted with various slogans, one of which was 'Swachh Bharat, Swastha Bharat, Samartha Bharat'.

**Methodology :** The team procured oil paints and brushes and other logistics. Proper administrative permissions, were sought before commencement of the wall painting. The painting was done in an eye catching manner and on noticeable places.

### Door-to-door meetings (sanitation/ hygiene/toilet usage/ hand wash)

#### No. of households visited conducted : 500 No. of people sensitized : 1200 No. of hours spent : 12

**Brief Description** : The families were educated about – i) toilet system where they were educated about the importance of maintaining clean and separate toilets for each house, the construction of the toilet, and the hazards of open defaecation; ii) hand hygiene where they were demonstrated the 7 steps of hand washing and its importance; iii) menstrual hygiene where they were educated about hygienic practises like using sanitary napkins or pads instead of cloths, changing of pads regularly, cleaning the private parts, also, the men in the house were told that how important it is to emotionally support the women and girls during their menstrual cycles; iv) drainage system where they were educated about the importance of having a closed drainage system and connecting the pipelines to the main drainage of the village; v) safe drinking water; vi) waste segregation where they were taught about the importance of segregating wastes in four colour coded bags.

**Methodology :** The team visited the houses in order to have interaction with the families. After explaining the motto of the campaign, the team inquired about the housing conditions of the family and accordingly educated them about various hygienic practices. During the visit pamphlets printed in Marathi explaining the water sanitation and menstrual hygiene were distributed.

# Nukkad Nataks/ Street Plays/ Swachhata-related Folk Song/ Dance performances- etc

#### No. of Performances conducted : 2 No. of people sensitized : 400 No. of hours spent : 2

**Brief Description :** The team conducted a street play in the centre of the village. Before the commencement of the play, the crowd was introduced to the motto of the Swachh Bharat Abhiyan. The volunteers enacted roles of common citizens. The play depicted the daily life scenarios like spitting and littering on the roads etc. and excerpts depicting problem of open defaecation. The villagers were made aware about how we as citizens had been contributing to the unhygienic conditions. The play delivered the key message using slogans like-'Swachh Bharat Ek He Mission, Swachhta Hai Desh Ka Bhushan' etc. Later, they were educated about various hygienic practices to be followed in day to day life. In addition to this, dance and singing competitions based on the theme of Swachh Bharat Abhiyan were organised.

**Methodology**: The street play was in the local language i.e. Marathi. The team contacted the local leader and informed about the play. The local leaders suggested to conduct the play on the 'Bazar Divas' of the village. Considering this the play was conducted in the centre of the village on the 'Bazar Divas' and the public was gathered by word of mouth publicity. For organizing the competition, the team members contacted the principals of the respective schools and put forth the proposal. The competition was held in the school premises. The school children participated in the dance and singing competitions and were given the memento of MGM, an idol of Mahatma Gandhi, as a token of appreciation.

# Help Panchayats draw up plans for installation of biogas plants wherever possible/required.

#### No. and scale of biogas plants planned : 100 No. of panchayat officials involved : 15 No. of hours spent : 4

**Brief Description** : A meeting with Panchayat Officials was arranged. The officials were educated about working and benefits of biogas plant and sensitized about the need of having biogas plants in the village. The working of biogas plant was explained in detail with the help of a poster depicting various parts of the biogas plant. The officials were advised to plan for the construction of optimum number of biogas plants in the pilot phase. During the meeting it was found that some villagers were already having working biogas plants. They were congratulated in the meeting and others were encouraged to follow their example.

**Methodology :** The team contacted the Sarpanch and requested to organize a meeting with the Gram Panchayat officials. The team leader introduced themselves as well as sensitized the officials regarding purpos of the meeting. Biogas plant was explained with the help of poster. The benefits were explained which are mainly production of methane gas which can be used as a fuel for cooking food as well as the manure which can be used in agriculture. The officials were addressed in the local language.

## Awareness Campaigns

#### No. of awareness drives conducted : 7 No. of people sensitized : 1200 No. of hours spent : 20

**Brief Description** : An awareness campaign was conducted in the PHC. At first, the PHC premises were studied to analyse the situation and it was found that there was an open well in the area which was found to be insanitary. After this the medical officers and other PHC staff were made aware about proper biomedical waste management. Further the campaigns were held in three different schools. Sessions were conducted for ASHA and Anganwadi workers. At all these places the team educated the people about the 7 hand washing steps, importance of separate toilets for males and females, and importance of maintaining clean water coolers or the availability of safe drinking water. Moreover, the offices (School and PHC) workers were sensitized about the 'Nirmal Karyalay' which included the importance of hand washing, use of dustbins and spitting pots in the office, maintenance of clean and separate toilets for male and female which would lead to a healthy environment in the office.

**Methodology :** The IEC campaign were conducted by the team members and volunteers. For this various audiovisual aids were used wherever necessary. The language of communication was Marathi as this is the local language. Posters, flipcharts and power-point presentations were utilized for the purpose of driving the message to the audience. Colour coded bags were used to explained the segregation of biomedical waste. The posters explaining the steps of hand washing were displayed and later on donated to the schools. After the session, interaction was carried out where all the queries raised by the audience were answered.

# Conducting Village or School-level Rallies

#### No. of rallies conducted : 2 No. of people sensitized : 300 No. of hours spent : 3

**Brief Description** : To create awareness amongst the villagers, the team of MGM MCH carried out a hygiene awareness rally in the streets of the village of Ladsawangi. The rally started from the PHC and headed towards the centre of the village, passing through its various areas and spreading the message through banners, placards which had various slogans or pieces of information written on them. Some of the slogans were-'Swachhta Aase Jithe, Aarogya Vase Tithe', 'Thode Tari Theva Jaan, Sarvajanik Thikani Honar Nahi Ghaan'. Another rally was conducted in the surrounding streets of the Zilla Parishad School. In this rally the school students had also participated. Through this rally the villagers were made aware about the hazards caused by unhygienic conditions and were education about importance of cleanliness.

**Methodology :** To conduct the rally, planning was done by the team members. It involved searching for the IEC literature, preparation of the placards and banners, contacting the Sarpanch and the school principal for seeking permission to carry out the rally. The route for the rally was chalked out. The participants were gathered, who covered the said route with placards and banners in hand, raising slogans about Swachh Bharat.

## Other Activity

Activity Name : Baseline Survey, Drone Mapping, Mini Swachh Survekshan, Swachhta Pratignya, Sensitization about the Swachhta Mobile Application

#### No. of beneficiaries : 10000 No. of hours spent : 50

**Brief Description** : BASELINE SURVEY & DRONE MAPPING: The team conducted a baseline survey. The sanitary conditions of the village were observed. In an unprecedented method, the mapping of waste collection sites was done with the help of drone camera. This was essential for the planning of health activities. MINI SWACHH SURVEKSHAN: With the help of faculties from the MGM, the team conducted cleanest ward competition. A survey was carried out to assess the overall cleanliness of various wards. Points were awarded based on use of sanitary latrines, waste disposal, drainage system and cleanliness of the streets. Mememtos were awarded to the winners. SWACHHTA PRATIGNYA: During the various awareness campaigns the villagers were given the pledge to keep their house, street, village and nation clean. SENSITIZATION ABOUT THE SWACHHTA MOBILE APPLICATION: The villagers were sensitized about the app which allows them to upload pictures of garbage dumps and get them cleaned.

**Methodology :** For the baseline survey the team hired a drone and visited the village. The footage from the drone camera was analysed and the sites of open dumping and sewage ditches were mapped. This information helped in understanding the extent of insanitary conditions and was used for the planning of activities.

Street Cleaning- Drain Cleaning- Cleaning of back alleys

#### Length of streets / drains / alleys cleaned : 15 No. of community participants : 150 No. of hours spent : 5

**Brief Description**: The team started the cleaning drive by sweeping the streets with brooms from various areas of the village. The villagers noticed the team and joined them in the cleaning drive. During this drive the drains were also cleaned. The team found that the village had open sewage drains. This issue was later on discussed with the Panchayat and they were advised regarding its closure. They were also advised regarding the construction of new drains and connecting it to the main drainage system of the village so that the wastes are channelized properly.

**Methodology :** The team divided itself into three groups who went into different parts of the village. This drive took place with the permission of the village Sarpanch. Logistics like brooms, gloves, masks, dustbins, garbage bags and dust pans were procured from the MGM Institute and Gram Panchayat.
